Worship Theme:

Theme: The Blood of the Covenant Today's scripture texts: Ex 24:1-2, 6-18; 2 Peter 1:16-21; Psalm 99

This Sunday, we draw from three different texts to understand the covenant we have with God and how He speaks on his Laws to us. Without the shedding of blood there is no covenant, Exodus 24 demonstrates that. This marks the inauguration of the covenant. It involves both God and the divine promises, but also the people and their commitment to do what God has said. The sacrificial offering is what ties these parts together.

Furthermore, the call of Moses to meet with God on the mountain to receive God's command affirms both the leadership and ministry of Moses and foreshadowing the meeting of Jesus with God on the mountain. In Exodus, God speaks his law to Moses to disseminate to the Israelites.

In 2 Peter 1: 16-21, we see that what the offering did for Israel in the Old Testament, Jesus has now done for us. He forgives the world's sins and justifies us before God. Peter talks of God's voice affirming Christ; in this way, God affirms that Jesus is the Word-made-flesh and is the new covenant in human form, through the shedding of his blood due to His death. He is, therefore, both the lamb and the new Law. Through God's affirmation of Christ, Jesus becomes the basis upon which we trust and adopt Christ's way of living.

Firm handshakes, hearty laughter and deep discussions on Scripture and faith. Even buying drinks out of possibly the cheapest vending machine in Singapore.

There was always something special about being with the church in the church building on Sunday (because the church is so much more than the building). We were never supposed to get comfortable with worshiping in the comforts of our own homes, separate and apart from our brothers and sisters.


But have we?






Family News, Concerns & Prayers

Have we ignored the conviction upon your heart after studying God's Word?

We may rationalized our wrongdoing with the thought that if God were really upset, He'd put a stop to things by disciplining us.

THESE THINGS YOU HAVE DONE AND I KEPT SILENCE; YOU THOUGHT THAT I WAS JUST LIKE YOU; I WILL REPROVE YOU AND STATE THE CASE IN ORDER **BEFORE YOUR EYES. "NOW** CONSIDER THIS, YOU WHO FORGET GOD, OR I WILL TEAR YOU IN PIECES, AND THERE WILL BE NONE TO DELIVER. PSALMS 50:21-22

Psalm 50:21 reminds us that the silence of heaven does not mean approval. Remaining in sin abuses the Lord's patience. When God seems slow to react, we hope He overlooks our sins. Because we like to continue in sin for the momentary pleasure is more appealing than obedience. But thankfully, the Father knows our weaknesses, our innate carnality, and the state of our spiritual growth, so He constraints His response. Motivated by His love and a desire to gently restore us to righteousness, God refrains from carrying out immediate punishment. Instead, He waits for the Holy Spirit's prodding to impact the our hearts. The weight of conviction is actually an invitation to turn from wrongdoing and return to godliness. Let us not test nor mock God's patience. Seek to be more like Him.
