



2020 Year Theme: **Be Strong and Courageous! Joshua 1:9**

Worship Theme:

Call to be transformed into a true follower of Christ Today's scripture texts: John 21:15-19; Acts 9:1-6; Psalms 30

Calling is, perhaps, the word that most clearly reflects what the Scriptures seek to tell us this week - Saul's conversion and call to be a follower (ultimately apostle) of Jesus, the psalmist's rescue and commitment (calling) to live as a worshipper and Peter, forgiven for his denial, restored to leadership of the apostles, and called to follow Christ even to his death. In response to this, the Scriptures invite us to discern the voice of God, i.e. to hear the call which comes to us and our communities in Christ's name - the call to worship, the call to be transformed into true followers of Jesus, and the call to minister to others in this disruptive time, the covid-19 crisis.

THE UNEXPECTED

William Shakespeare, in Cymbeline, wrote,

Fortune brings in some boats that are not steered.

Covid-19 arrived on our shores unannounced and uninvited and is certainly not regarded as a quest. The virus had already infected many countries, but we did not expect to have the nation so quickly shut down with virtually everyone told to stay at home!

The unexpected always catches us by surprise. Not a nice feeling because we like to know what's going on, what's in the pipeline. We like to be in control.

ACTS OF THE APOSTLES 9:1-19

Ananias did not expect to be told to help the feared persecutor, Paul of Tarsus and Paul's conversion was the most unexpected gift for the first Christian communities. How could they expect someone who had a warrant to arrest and kill the followers of Jesus, and who had earlier watched and approved the stoning of the deacon, Stephen [Acts 7:55-8:1], to be accepted as a friend?

These first Christians had to overcome quite justifiable fear, suspicion, even perhaps hatred, in order to embrace Paul. How different our story would have been had they not done so! Consider today's scripture passages and return to them during the week.

- Are there groups or individuals in your own life that you avoid or find difficult in any way?
- Do you ever find yourself saying or thinking, How could I be expected to forgive such a person/insult/rejection/abuse...?
- How prepared are you to expect the unexpected?

Perspective: 7 June 2020

Never in the same Boat! So please have some empathy.

After listening to some pretty harsh comments and arguing over reopening or completely shutting down the economy for another two weeks, someone in his right mind wrote this:

WE ARE NOT IN THE SAME BOAT

I heard that we are all in the same boat, but it's not like that. We are in the same storm, but not in the same boat. Your ship could be shipwrecked and mine might not be. Or vice versa.

For some, quarantine is optimal. A moment of reflection, of reconnection, easy in flip flops, with a cocktail or coffee. For others, this is a desperate financial and family crisis.

For some that live alone, they're facing endless loneliness. While for others, it is peace, rest and time with their mother, father, sons and daughters.

With the weekly increase in unemployment, some are bringing in more money to their households than they were working. Others are working more hours for less money due to pay cuts or loss in sales.

For some not getting on with family, domestic abuse is rife...we never know what goes on behind closed doors.

Some are concerned about getting a certain candy for celebration while others are concerned if there would be enough bread, milk and eggs for the weekend.

Some want to go back to work because they don't qualify for unemployment and are running out of money. Others want to kill those who break the quarantine.

Some are home, spending 2-3 hours a day helping their children with online schooling while others are spending 2-3 hours a day to educate their children on top of a 10-12 hours workday.

Some have experienced the near death of the virus.

Some have already lost someone from it and some are not sure if their loved ones are going to make it. Others don't believe this is a big deal.

Some have faith in God and expect miracles during this 2020. Others say the worst is yet to come.


So, friends, we are not in the same boat. We are going through a time when our perceptions and needs are completely different.

Each of us will emerge, in our own way, from this storm. It is very important to see beyond what is seen at first glance. Not just looking, actually seeing.


We are all on different ships during this storm, experiencing a very different journey.
