

Get A Real Relationship.

Psalm 31, an individual complaint psalm, expresses confidence in God's mercy and concludes with reflections on the blessing and the curse.

Let us express confidence in God for we are not ashamed of the gospel.

The threads that tie this week's scriptures together are the themes of the law and God's response to obedience and disobedience.



The texts from Romans present Paul's reflections on the relationship between faith, grace, and the law. It concludes that the "law of faith" does not overthrow the law, but upholds it instead.

The gospel of Matthew urges actions as well as words, and distinguishes between those who will and those who will not enter the kingdom of heaven.
