The account from Judges 4 tells us that Deborah fortified Barak with her presence (She came alongside of him because she knew what God was calling him to do; even though he was timid, insecure, and fearful); she turned his attention toward God (The man may be the head, but the woman is the neck that turns the head); and she delivered dignity to him (She made sure Barak received some of the credit for the victory.) That gives us an acronym: FTD – fortify, turn, deliver.

Everyone needs to be fortified, turned to God and delivered dignity (FTDed) and everyone needs to FTD. But if a man doesn't get FTDed by another man, it might hurt but it doesn't injure his manhood. If a woman doesn't FTD another woman, it might hurt, but it doesn't injure or assault her femininity. <u>But when a woman doesn't FTD a guy, it more than hurts him: it actually injures something in him.</u> And this is why we have a generation of men who find it hard to step up and stand up to be the men that they need to be.

God desires for His love and His will to be woven into every part of our lives, including our work and family. How can women encourage men to step up in fathering?

First, wives need to be aware that men feel important when they are being esteemed as professionally accomplished. Wives need to give affirmation to their husbands. Second, men have the misconception that mums are more naturally suited to caregiving than dads. Men need to be aware of how essential their roles as husbands and fathers are. When men take on their family responsibilities, it helps improve mothers' mental health and bring about relationship satisfaction too. Last but not least, dads need to know that their fathering uniquely benefits their children.

Just like Deborah, wives need to support their husbands by coming alongside of them; wives need to turn their husbands' attention toward God; and wives need to convey respectfulness towards their husbands.

Both men and women are challenged to stand up and step up in their faith in Christ and to encourage each other unto victory.



Our current Sunday morning Bible classes on the Job series will conclude on 23 May, 2021. We want to take this opportunity to thank all the teachers who had a part in sharing the encouraging and enriching lessons from the Job series.

Beginning next Sunday, 30 May 2021, we will begin a new 18 lesson series based on the book of Joshua, entitled "Be Strong & Courageous."

Introduction to the Book of Joshua

The book is named after its chief character Joshua, Moses' successor. Joshua's name means "the Lord is Salvation." Centuries later, Jesus was given the same name.

The book recounts the Israelites' entrance into the promised land under the leadership of the Joshua. The events of the book span over twenty-five years, starting soon after the death of Moses (Joshua 1:1) around 1406 BC, before the conquest of Canaan commenced. The conquest of Canaan took about seven years, and Joshua's final address and subsequent death came almost twenty years later.


The book begins with the nation of Israel poised at the banks of the Jordan River, across from Jericho. It records the details of numerous military campaigns that defeated the inhabitants of the land. It is a story of contradictions. On one hand, God gave the land that He had promised to the nation. On the other hand, the people failed to possess the land completely, allowing some inhabitants to remain. While God fulfilled His side of the bargain, the Israelites did not finish the job and in later years the Canaanites became a damaging influence on Israel as years went by.

The book ends with Joshua's regathering of the nation for his final exhortation.

What can we learn from the book?

1. Watch Israel Inherit the Land

Why did it require the slaughter of the land's inhabitants? This question has often been raised by Bible Students with understandable difficulty. Humans were banished from the garden of Eden because of sin, and there won't be any sin in the new Eden. The promised land is a taste of that perfection to come. The obedience and purity required for Israel to dwell with God in the promised land teaches us about what is required for man to dwell with God anywhere and in eternity.



2. Our Covenant-Keeping God

God's covenant with Israel which was established through Moses, requires total obedience in order to inherit the promised land God promised. This requirement is reinforced clearly in the book of Joshua (1:7–8).

This insight into God's unfailing character as a Covenant-Keeping God is an important theological takeaway from the book of Joshua - a take away which helps us understand our dependence upon the Lord for our own salvation.

As we watch God meticulously keep his promises to Israel, both in blessing for obedience and in cursing for disobedience, we are reminded that he keeps his new covenant promises with us just as well.

But in the new covenant, God has given us a perfectly obedient covenant mediator, a Saviour greater than Joshua, to lead us into a salvation greater than Canaan.

God is the ultimate promise-keeper. As faithful and present as He was with Israel, so He is with us. "Be strong and courageous! Do not tremble or be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go" (1:9).

3. Learn from the Faith of "Outcasts"

By giving the promised land to Israel, the Lord shows us the kind of salvation He brings. By keeping His covenant promises through Joshua, the Lord shows us the kind of Saviour He provides. By saving Rahab (representing the Gentiles and the Outcasts) by faith, the Lord shows us the kind of people He saves.

In this story we see the promised blessing of Abraham comes to the nations. Behind the walls of fortified and hardened Jericho is a Gentile prostitute who believes that the Lord is the God of heaven who has given Israel the land (Joshua 2). She believes and is saved. When the land is divided, the first person to receive an inheritance is Caleb, a Kenizzite, whose people were formerly Gentiles (Josh. 14:13; Gen. 15:19). They believed and are counted among God's people.

Conclusion

As we read the book of Joshua, we take our cues from the New Testament authors, who commended the faith of people like Rahab, and praise God for bringing salvation all the way to us (Heb. 11:31; James 2:25). We learn that no one is too sinful and undeserving of God's salvation; that great faith often comes from unexpected quarters.

We will learn spiritual principles that can help us to be courageous and strong in the midst of opposition. We also learn important lessons from the successes the Israelites experienced because of their obedience to the Lord and from the failures they experienced because of their disobedience.

Joshua is an excellent book to study if one wants to learn how to live out our Christian lives in light of God's divine and glorious mission. God's people are on a mission and He has more to accomplish than just make our lives comfortable. We need to not only learn how to live our lives properly under the divine guidance of our Lord in this world but also understand that there are battles we need to face and overcome in order to expand and establish God's kingdom in our own journey to "the promised land.". Every battle that is faced in this book provides some wisdom and instruction on how we ourselves are to depend upon God and accomplish His great will here on earth.
