### Faithfulness In Frustration | By John Lim



First it was an unsuspecting boy, barely a teenager, suddenly felled by an axe stroke from another boy, barely of legal age. Less than a day later, the government enforced rules that restricted movement and social activities. Again.

It felt like we're living in some dystopian teenage fiction novel. I wish as hard as I can to wake from this garish nightmare, from the shockwaves that have rippled through our nation's consciousness and shaken us to the core.

This has to be fake news, I tell myself, things aren't supposed to be this way. We were supposed to be headed towards wholeness and recovery and the life we once knew. We weren't supposed to regress from it!

The next thing I know, I'm watching Angela Lim report the details on News 5 Tonight. Nightmares are terrifying, but it's scarier when they turn out to be real.

So what do we do now?

One option is to let frustration overwhelm us. The more we read the news to stay up-to-date, the more darkness creeps over our hearts. As we read about the River Valley High School incident, we realize anew that depression, suicidal thoughts and other mental conditions are more endemic than ever. As we read about the new

restrictions, we learn that livelihoods, especially in the volatile F&B sector, have to endure yet another round of disappointments and dashed hopes. Before long, those depressing thoughts have become our own.

Another option is to fall asleep. The world is just too broken to fix. There's nothing I can do to change the situation. Those of us who are lucky aren't directly impacted, so we say,"It's not my problem." And then we try to go about life as per normal, ordering GrabFood and scrolling through Shopee sales. We pretend that everything is all right in our own lives while a hurting world screams outside our windows.

Neither of those options seem satisfactory. That's because neither of them are Christian.

How then, as followers of Jesus Christ, do we live in response to the pain of our world? What are we supposed to do when our news feeds flood us with nothing but bad news of worsening brokenness?

Is there perhaps a *third* response—one that is neither consumed by frustration nor falls asleep to it?

I propose that it depends on what story we choose to live with. The story of Christianity says that we are children of light and heirs of everlasting hope. We've inherited a legacy that says the Creator of the Universe will one day recreate all things, mend every shattered life, heal every hurting heart, and restore all things to righteousness.

Our story says that God is *not* blind to a hurting world, nor is He deaf to the cries of the afflicted. Rather, God took on human flesh so that He could see with human eyes and hear with human ears. Jesus Christ stretched out human hands, cried human tears, and died a human death.

God doesn't get any closer to humanity than that.

To faithfully respond to the events of our day is to become like Jesus. He joined us in our death in order to bring about new life. What would it look like to join in the suffering of our nation, yet be driven by the hope of a brighter future?

Perhaps you feel moved to pray, whether it be a deep, intimate conversation with God in your own room, or calling up friends to cry out to God together.

Perhaps you know a friend who is directly affected by the incidents of this past week. And you have a phone, a computer, internet connection, and multiple channels through which you could contact them.

Perhaps you have a social media following that could use a ray of light in the middle of this darkness. Why not stop their scrolling by sharing a message of hope?

By the mercies of God, do not give in to frustration. Do not fall asleep to the pain. However you do it, choose faithfulness, and let us boldly offer a radical hope to our world that lasts beyond sickness and death, even to everlasting life.
