COVID-19 Guidelines

- You do not have to register for worship at our website.
- You must be fully vaccinated to attend in-person worship.
- If you are **not vaccinated**, you need a negative PET result from an accredited clinic no earlier than 12:30pm on Saturday.
- **Children under 12** who are not vaccinated can still attend and do not need to go for PET.

We understand that some members have difficulty meeting the above criteria and cannot yet return to worship. We miss you very much and thank you for your understanding as we adhere to safe management measures for the safety of the community. We look forward to having you back when restrictions relax further in the coming weeks.



COVID-19 Measures

The leadership welcomes the recent easing of safe management measures by the authorities, which allows more attendees for the in-person worship.



Please take note of the following requirements:

- In-person congregational worship will be allowed up to a maximum of 1000 persons (limited by church auditorium size) with the conditions indicated below.
- All worshippers, religious and supporting workers are to be vaccinated.
- Attendees are to be divided into zones, holding no more than 50 worshippers each.
- No crossing of zones allowed.
- All attendees are required to wear their masks.
- Singing will not be allowed during the in-person worship.

What qualifies as "vaccinated"?

- Fully vaccinated, i.e. has received the full regimen of Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty, Moderna or WHO EUL vaccines, with an additional two weeks for the vaccine to be fully effective,
- recovered from COVID-19, or
- has obtained a negative result on a pre-event test (PET) taken in the past 24 hours before the expected end of the event. Note that this test has to be from an accredited clinic.

• As children 12 years and below are ineligible for the National Vaccination, they are exempted from undergoing PET.

Procedures for attending in-person worship on Sunday

- There is no requirement to pre-register for the in-person worship.
- Please ensure that you are vaccinated.
- For those who are not vaccinated, please ensure that you have completed the Pre-Event Testing (PET) no earlier than 24 hours prior to the end of the meeting. (Eg. Worship ends at 12.30pm on Sunday, test to be done after 12.30pm on Saturday). Please bring along the test result to the church for verification.
- Attendees will be seated in different zones.
- Kindly ensure that you check in and out via the Safe Entry Gateway.

We seek the cooperation of everyone attending the in-person worship to abide with the regulations and procedures for the health and safety of everyone. It is the leadership's prayer and desire that members will make the effort to worship together in-person.

A Glimpse into Worship Preparation By John Lim

The Significance of Sunday

In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. In six days, He brought forth everything from the stars of the heavens to the creatures of land and sea. On the seventh day, He rested and enjoyed the work of His hands. To this day, Jews observe the Sabbath as a day for rest, enjoyment, and worship.



But what comes after that? What happens on the eighth day?

The early Christians recognised that Jesus rose on Sunday, the day after Sabbath, for a reason. Sunday, the eighth day, is the dawn of a new creation.

Today, Christians gather on Sunday to celebrate this same miraculous reality. It is a special day where we affirm our faith in God, encounter the body of the risen Christ, and recommit ourselves to walking with the Spirit.

Since I began full-time ministry in July, I have been privileged to play a part in coordinating and preparing our worship services. I'd like to give you a glimpse of how our Men-to-Serve have been working hard to bring about a richer and more meaningful worship experience every week.

What We Do

Every Tuesday for the last two months, the worship team meets via Zoom to talk through the worship plan. First, the preacher shares the direction and themes of his message. The rest of the team shares insights from their own preparation, building on and riffing off from what others have said.

Gradually, with the sermon as our starting point, the team perceives the overarching message that God is telling, through every segment of worship—Scripture, song, Lord's Supper thoughts, even announcements—in a unique and beautiful way.

Sometimes, we adjust certain parts to improve clarity and unity. We may adjust the Scripture text or songs to align with the theme more fully. In August, when the theme was "Communion", we changed the order of worship so that the sermon would prepare us for the Lord's Supper that came after it, rather than before.

In addition, each week's team has a WhatsApp chat group so that we can suggest ideas that arise during the preparation. It frees us from needing to "get everything right" at the Tuesday meeting, which helps to keep our meeting within one hour. It also reminds us that preparing for worship is not a one-off thing. It is about dwelling on the Word over time and being attentive to the Spirit as He guides our meditation.

Thus, the worship service is not just "a sermon plus a few extras", but a rich, multidimensional proclamation of the Good News of Jesus through a harmony of song, prayer, and Word.

Going Forward

I want to thank and commend the worship leaders of the past two months for their patience and commitment. It takes time and effort to create meaningful worship services week after week, and an hourlong Zoom meeting on a Tuesday night can be a big sacrifice.

That said, if we truly believe that Sunday worship is the pinnacle of our week; if we believe that our ultimate purpose as human beings is to glorify God; if we believe that the Lord of the Universe is uniquely present with His gathered people and about to speak—surely this occasion deserves our utmost preparation.

Going forward, worship leaders should expect to participate in this weekly rhythm of preparation. There will be a time for the worship team to meet, pray, and plan together. There will also be the expectation that each leader spends time during the week for personal preparation.

Perhaps someone might ask, "I can prepare my segment on my own. Why do I still need to meet with the rest of the team?" Because leading worship is not a one-man show. The Sunday service is not a series of disconnected one-acts; everyone serves as part of a team in service of the same message.

No football player trains separately from the team and expects to win the World Cup. Your smartphone would not work if it only had the screen. Jesus—the literal Son of God who could have done everything by Himself—created a community, the Church, to carry out His mission. The same is true of us who lead worship.
