Ministry Opportunity | Gladiolus Place

Gladiolus Place (GP) is a residential home for vulnerable teenage girls between 12-20. For the last few years, PPCOC has been blessed to partner with GP in ministering to these girls with the love of Jesus.



We currently have a team that organises fortnightly devotionals, Bible courses, holiday celebrations (e.g. Christmas and CNY) and sponsors them for various needs.

We are looking for female mentors to be part of a <u>Family Care</u> <u>Team</u> for a 3-6 month period. Each week, mentors will spend 6-12 in-person hours with the girls. Specialised training and courses will be provided where appropriate.

Skype. FaceTime. Video conferencing. Zoom. Less than two years ago, these technologies were novelties. Today, they are necessities.

Today, we've perfected the art of Zoom "etiquette". We know to look sharp from the waist up because no one sees the lower half, saving time and laundry. We've learned to "unmute" ourselves before speaking, and also to "mute" ourselves again before we say something better left unheard!

At most of my Zoom meetings though, unless it's a one-on-one meeting or we're all close friends, about half of the group turns off their video. I always thought that Zoom was meant to preserve as much of that face-to-face element as possible, but it seems that most of us prefer not to show our faces unless we absolutely have to.

Granted, we usually have our reasons for keeping our videos off. But how does our video choice affect others in the virtual room? It sends the message that:

- "I'm not (don't want to be) fully present in this conversation."
- "I'm not comfortable enough to let you see my face."
- "I'm okay to be included, but don't expect me to be highly involved since I'll probably be doing other things that I don't want you to see."

Keeping our videos turned off enables us to be present, but in the least way possible. I suppose that is why some organisations specifically require that people turn on their videos during meetings -"We need to see your face to know that you are here with us."

As it turns out, that is part of the Christian story. In the beginning, man and woman walked with God in the Garden of Eden, face-to-face in perfect relationship. When they sinned, that perfect relationship was broken and they hid themselves from God in shame (Gen. 3:8). God withdrew His face from them because His Holiness was too great for them to bear (Ex. 33:20).

But in Jesus, God has shown us His face. John 1:14 says that "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, the glory of the one and only Son, full of grace and truth."

God could have saved us with a snap of His fingers. He could have parted the heavens in a blaze of light and spoken with a thunderous voice. He could have rescued us from a far distance, never needing to contaminate His Holy self with our sinful world.

And yet He chose to save us by becoming Emmanuel, God-With-Us. He crossed the impossible distance from divinity to humanity. He became so fully present that He would eat and drink with us, laugh

with children and weep at deathbeds, and finally suffer and die for us. There was no part of our humanity that Christ did not experience.

By being so fully present, Jesus said to us:

- I am with you always, even to the end of the age.
- Look at my face and see in my eyes how much I love you.
- I love you so much that I will share the whole of your broken human condition and overcome it.

Our God was willing to go through death itself to show up for us. How can we show up for other people with the presence of Christ?

Here's a wild idea. Perhaps it's as simple as turning on your video at your next Zoom call. Put on a proper shirt. Comb your hair or do your makeup a little more. Turn on your video and show that you are fully present for that meeting. And who knows if someone else will see in your face the presence of Jesus?
