We're focusing on Local Missions to prepare for our Missions Month in October. Let us pray for God to lead us to become a community that loves those at our own doorstep.



A Minister's Musings





I have a friend who used to keep a whiteboard next to her shower. I am convinced she is a genius for doing this. She found that some of her most brilliant ideas came during the shower and she needed to write them down as soon as possible before they faded away.

I guess that most of us are like this. There we are, minding our own business, lathering our hair with foamy shampoo, making sure the water temperature is just right. We might even space out and forget whether we had already used body soap or if we need to wash our face again.

And then it hits you. Straight out of nowhere, you think of a solution to the problem you've been working on for weeks. The precise words form in your mind to reply to a client's email—professional, elegant, and maybe even amusing. You remember that important thing you were going to discuss with your spouse but you had forgotten during dinner.

It's almost like how Popeye gets super strength from eating spinach. Maybe our brains become ridiculously overpowered when in contact with steaming hot water.

A Minister's Musings

I think that the shower is where we are least distracted. It is the one place where we cannot bring in our devices—no phone, no watch, no earphones. Even if our devices were waterproof, we can't operate them because (if you're normal) we need both hands to do stuff!

In the shower, we allow our minds to be bored. Our bodies work by muscle memory, and our minds can wander without being chained to a screen. In that freedom, we devote our full focus to what matters most, birthing new modes of thinking and creative solutions.

I think that there's a theological perspective to this. You see, God designed us to be creatures of worship. That means He designed us to love, adore, revere Him with everything that we have.

Everything we could ever want is found in Him. Our hearts will only be satisfied when we find and welcome Him into every corner of our lives as our sole love. As the great theologian Augustine of Hippo famously prayed, "Thou hast created us for Thyself, and our hearts are restless till they rest in Thee."

Yet we live distractedly in virtually (pun intended) every other part of our lives. Technology penetrates every minute of our existence—the office, the bedroom, the public transport commute, the overseas holiday, the dinner table, the worship service.

We can't stop being plugged in, and we are always hyper alert just in case a notification comes in and we simply have to respond to it.

We learn to love immediate entertainment over sitting patiently with the Lord. We grow habits of distraction rather than focus. We skim instead of deep reading and thinking.

We are absolutely restless, always alt-tabbing and multitasking and jumping between apps in the name of productivity or mindless entertainment. Is it any wonder that we are busy, tired and unsatisfied all the time?

Perhaps it's time to rediscover those sanctuaries of rest. To carve out space in our lives where we can turn our attention fully to worship God. Space where our minds are unshackled from our screens, freed to wander, wonder and worship the glorious mysteries of God, where we find our fullest satisfaction.

Maybe that means the few minutes you spend in the shower. Or powering down your devices an hour before you go to bed. Or maybe it's just sitting, closing your eyes, and breathing deeply for a few minutes, acknowledging the presence of the God who is worthy of all worship.

May God speak to you this week, in the shower or otherwise.
