Movie Meditation - The Eternals

If you're a Marvel fan, you've heard about The Eternals: a team of powerful superheroes who overcome impossible odds to save the world. I really enjoyed it, but not in the usual way. Let me explain.



(By the way, potential spoilers ahead! You've been warned :D)

While the movie has some pretty cool visuals, a diverse cast, and (hyper) nerdy historical references, I enjoyed Eternals because it challenged me to think deeply about my beliefs. (Did I mention that I consider myself nerdy? Does anyone else watch Marvel movies for deep philosophical introspection?)

Basically, the story of Eternals is that a team of immortal superheroes are sent on a mission by Arishem, the God-figure, to protect earth from destructive demon-like creatures.

However, after 7000 years on earth of helping create civilizations and technology, they begin to question their purpose. They wonder if Arishem really knows what he's doing or if he made a mistake.

To simplify the plot twists, Arishem is shown to be a power-hungry authoritarian who abuses his power for selfish benefit and uses the heroes as mere tools. The heroes save the world by rebelling against their creator and their original purpose.

Perhaps that description of Arishem felt cringy—and also uncomfortably familiar. If you think about it, it's basically the Eden story but with a fundamental difference.

Minister's Musings

In Genesis 3, humans wrongfully rebel against a good God and earn their own suffering. But Eternals actually celebrates the rebellion of creation against its creator as a good thing, mainly because the creator isn't so good after all.

While we may complain about the anti-Christian/religion agenda of this one movie, it's just reflecting what most of our culture believes. God, or any authority figure, is considered inherently evil and selfish, even if he claims to be good and benevolent. Humanity must rebel against that authority and decide what is right for themselves.

How do we respond to that and stand up for God? We're bombarded with cultural messages like this all the time. They undermine our Christian belief system and celebrate a different sort of "gospel"--one where humans can (and should) thrive without God's interference.

I believe the best response to the story of Eternals lies in our own story--the true gospel.

Rather than a needy God who demands sacrifices, we find Christ who selflessly sacrificed His life for others. Rather than a god who manipulates mankind, we find Christ who allows Himself to be tortured and crucified by His own creation. Rather than an "angry policeman in the sky", we find a God who in love became flesh to walk with us in our suffering.

Arishem, the god of the Eternals, is (thankfully) not the God of Israel revealed to us in Scripture, who is "a God gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness (Exodus 34:6)."

As culture drifts further away from the "gospel truth", maybe the best response is to immerse ourselves more deeply in the timeless message of Scripture. So keep watching movies, keep engaging with culture; only let us do so when we are armed with the Word of God.
