In this famous scene in "The Empire Strikes Back", Luke Skywalker despairs at the task before him. When he shrugs his shoulders and resigns himself to "trying" anyway, Master Yoda chides him for his lack of faith in the limitless power available to him. That's actually not too far removed from the Christian story.

Our new worship series is on the Sermon on the Mount. Following the approach of biblical scholar Randy Harris, we believe that Jesus calls us to actually live this kind of kingdom life. It's not so lofty that only the religious elite can do it. It's not an impossible standard which we know we'll fail, but hopelessly try anyway to earn points for effort.

Through Jesus, it is possible to live the kingdom life. So let's drop the excuses. Let's "try" less and "do" more.




Elder Terry Wan Steps Down


