

Great Or Least In The Kingdom

There is power in the blood of Christ, wonder-working power. William Gurnall wrote in "The Christian In Complete Armour" that "Christ's blood is a balm to heal your wounds." The teachings in the Sermon on the Mount were written for those in the Kingdom. The instructions are doable, though not with perfection. However, we are emboldened by Christ's blood and the Holy Spirit to aim for perfection.

As Christians, we practice the Spirit of the law and not simply the "applied law". We do this inside-out as we walk in love, seeking desperately to imitate Christ. Jesus came to embody the law, not as a proponent of lawlessness; he created it, after all! But He did rebuke the vicious law-keeping of the scribes and the Pharisees.

Rules, signs and constitutions protect us and govern interactions. We don't follow them simply to avoid fines or punishments. Today's message encourages you to see past the "cans" and "cannots".

Weekly Nugget | Kuek Lee Hock



He replied: "Watch out that you are not deceived. For many will come in my name, claiming, 'I am he,' and, 'The time is near.' Do not follow them. When you hear of wars and uprisings, do not be frightened. These things must happen first, but the end will not come right away." Then he said to them: "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes, famines and pestilences in various places, and fearful events and great signs from heaven." (Luke 21:8-11)

This week I will begin a series of weekly nuggets to glean insights from the events that happened over the last two years. These insights are part of my personal reflection, as I struggle with "why": why have all these events happened so frequently and with such great intensity? Floods, forest fires, haze, volcanic eruptions, pandemics have relentlessly visited Earth. They are becoming the norm, filling up news headlines all over the world.

My aim of this weekly nugget series is to focus on our walk with God. In my reflections, I asked myself several questions:

- 1. What happened to the world that I grew up with over the last 6 decades the pace of life, life's purpose, beliefs and values, the environment that impacted the hope and security of daily living?
- 2. Why is daily living so chaotic and uncertain? Maybe humans have meddled and tampered with the very creation of God? I began to mediate on God's creation in Gen 1:10 where "God called the dry ground "land," and the gathered waters he called "seas." And God saw that it was good."
- 3. Have I messed up by having humanity's self-gratifying urge to be 'smarter' than the Creator? If so, what should I do differently to walk closer to God?

Weekly Nugget | Kuek Lee Hock

Lesson #1: Awareness of the brevity and the fragility of life.

James 4:13-15 reminds us: "Now listen, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money." Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. Instead, you ought to say, "If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that."

Jesus also said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for me will find it. What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul?" (Matthew 16:24-26)

Lesson #2: Be prepared for the eternity that is ahead, not be consumed with our pride and self-gratification in this life on earth!

Consider Genesis 3:1 "Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals the Lord God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden'?" Genesis 3:4 goes on: "You will not certainly die," the serpent said to the woman. "For God knows that when you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."

Adam and Eve fell for Satan's trap. They wanted to be smarter than the Creator. For everything in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life comes not from the Father but from the world. (1 John 2:16)

Lesson #3: Be convinced that we are just a passing through this life; our 'treasures' are laid up for us in heaven.

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. (Matthew 6: 19-20).

Let God take control as the driver of our daily life! Then getting to our next destination in life will be a breeze!
