"I have told you these things, so that in Me you may have [perfect] peace. In the world you have tribulation and distress and suffering, but be courageous [be confident, be undaunted, be filled with joy]; I have overcome the world." [My conquest is accomplished, My victory abiding.] John 16:33 (AMP)

In John 16, Jesus speaks to His disciples about His impending death and departure, as well as their desertion. Jesus tells them, "A time is coming and in fact has come when you will be scattered, each to your own home. You will leave me all alone. Yet I am not alone, for my Father is with me." (John 16:32)

This must have been disconcerting for the disciples to hear, so Jesus immediately followed up with His comforting words in verse 33, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble, but take heart! I have overcome the world."

In this verse, we see that the disciples faced three realities:

1) The followers of Jesus will suffer great distress;

2) Jesus has already won the victory;

3) He didn't want His disciples to be under the delusion that their future ministry would be full of ease and comfort, and He doesn't want us to think that either.

21st Century Challenges

"If the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first. If you belonged to the world, it would love you as its own. As it is, you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world. That is why the world hates you." (John 15: 18-19)

1. Compartmentalization.

This year, we've watched our lives become dictated by the COVID pandemic. We chat with multiple people at a time, post one fragment of our lives here and another there, consume visual media in one window and read the Bible in another, etc.

This fractures our lived experience into disconnected compartments. It wreaks havoc on our mental and spiritual development and growth. Integrity means wholeness (integer = whole number). All parts of our lives should be (mind, body and soul) integrated and aligned with the Lordship of Christ.

As individuals and as a family, how are we doing as a part of God's Church today?

2. The Idol of Individual Rights and Autonomy

This is the key threat to the Lord's Church in the 21st century. Our global culture says that individuals can "be and do whatever feels right to you". This philosophy of expressive individualism is also "the Pride of Life" and it is fundamentally at odds with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, which calls us to bow to the lordship of Christ.

As God's children need to examine our convictions, sincerity and authenticity to the authority of Jesus Christ as revealed to us in Scripture. "For everything in the world – the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life – comes not from the Father but from the world." (1 John 2:16)

3. Aversion to Commitment.

We live in a culture that is averse to commitment. Because of a FOMO ("fear of missing out") worldview, we prefer to keep options open rather than commit to something or someone, in case we miss out on other possibilities.

So, people are less likely to be affiliated with a religion or be tied down to major life commitments than previous generations. We see people preferring to stay single or get married later in life than our parents and grandparents did.

This will gradually lead to a weak (or no) commitment to the local church. What we get is discipleship that is more virtual than real, especially with the COVID pandemic that has been ongoing for more than two years!

Against this backdrop, we the church need to stay relevant by reinforcing community life instead of the individualistic lifestyle already rooted in society. Let's connect more at every given opportunity and commit to the body of Christ.

Solution: Are we listening to God's whisper?

'As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in His love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. My command is this: love each other as I have loved you." (John 15:9-12)

We are not called to overcome the world alone. Jesus has already provided us with a certain future: a "living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" and "an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade" (2 Peter 1:3-4). So we can "take heart and be of good courage."

Reflect and Respond

1. Review our worldviews and life's assumptions. Clearly identify them. 2. What can we learn from God's gentle whisper (the Bible) for God's view?

3. How can we be guided by God's wisdom and apply it to our daily life?

4. Meditate on the verse(s) you have chosen.

5. Pray for God's strength and help to become more and more like Christ.

Prayer:

Father, we ask for patience to wait and listen for Your gentle whisper today. Quieten the lures and calls of the prevailing voices to pursue worldliness. Instead, may we desire to listen to Your whispers of hope, peace and loving guidance so we can focus and be mindful of Your will and purpose for us. May Your peace fill our hearts today. In Jesus' Name we pray, Amen.
