

"I warn everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: if anyone adds to them, God will add to him the plagues described in this book, and if anyone takes away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God will take away his share in the tree of life and in the holy city, which are described in this book." (Revelation 22:18-19)

God's vital warning from these verses is that the Bible is now complete; no one should add to it. Neither will God add any more words to it. Whosoever adds to the Words of the Bible is guilty of tampering with the image of the Sovereign God. If anyone takes away from the Words of the Book, God shall deny that person the entrance to the New Jerusalem for tampering with the image of God.

Against this backdrop, we as a church need to stay relevant by reinforcing community life based on God's instructive wisdom than in any other source for His truth.

Solution: Our faith at its core comes from hearing from the Words of God that is deeply rooted in the inspired Word of God. While hope lives in the mind, faith is anchored in the heart and the spirit. It is not based on personal preferences and justification.

Faith is as important as the air we breathe. While oxygen nourishes the body, faith nourishes our heart and soul. It flows through every fibre and cell of our body. It's in every muscle and strand of thought.

21st Century Challenges

Consumerism's tentacles have infiltrated the church. Many go to Sunday services to "get something." Resulting in "church shopping" and "what can I get out from each sermon". We pursue such outcomes frequently. We choose churches that fit our checklist of preferences, like choosing a new car or buying a new handphone.

But churches must challenge this mentality. Church is a place where members of a body come together for purposes beyond our personal pursuits. It's an invitation from God to become His disciples. It is NOT an invitation to affirm self-actualization, success or to attain an elevated earthly status.

The second challenge is that of social media. There are positive benefits social media offers but it also poses challenges to the church, particularly the obsession for popular trends that feed egoistic pride. Nowadays, trendy fads are popularised via the social media. And there's no telling how easily "cool stuff" can contaminate God's teachings with popular opinions.

Closely associated with social media is the allure of the celebrity lifestyle. These "platforms" have become so pervasive in the 21st century that uses AI, data-mining to figure the basic human urges that seeks immediate gratification and social acceptance. Luring many away from their beliefs in God and the local church.

The third challenge is the desire to keep up with the latest trends. One prevailing trend is the challenge to "rethink and remake the church". One can be exhausted just by reading the proliferation of books that comes out yearly to set some new paradigm for church revival.

One is tempted to be 'trendy' instead of relying on God's stipulated structure and form of worship. We should not see every cultural change as an invitation to reinvent the wheel.

In Numbers 20: 7-12, where God commanded Moses to give the Israelites water to drink by speaking to a rock. But Moses in his own wisdom struck the rock with his staff. After all, it had worked once before (Exodus 17:6). But God was displeased by Moses' disobedience to His explicit instructions and barred him from entering the Promised Land.

Simply put, the importance of obedient faith motivated by God's love for us cannot be underestimated. We are not called to overcome the world alone.

Jesus has already provided us with the ultimate example: And the tempter came and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, command that these stones become bread." 4 But Jesus replied, "It is written and forever remains written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes out of the mouth of God." Matt 4:3-4

REFLECT AND RESPOND

- 1. Review the 21st century worldviews shared, how do these perspectives impact our daily Christian living?
- 2. What can we learn from God's gentle whisper (from the Bible) for God's view to counter these worldviews?
- 3. 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes out of the mouth of God.' How are you guided by God's wisdom in your daily life?
- 4. Meditate on the verse(s) you have chosen.
- 5. Pray for God's strength and help to become more and more like Christ.

Quieten the lures and calls of the prevailing voices to pursue worldliness.
