



Relaxed Safe Management Measures



With the recent relaxation of SMMs on 26 April, all members, including **unvaccinated individuals, are allowed to return to inperson worship.**



The demolition phase of the reconstruction has begun, starting with the tearing down of the building at the back of the church and subsequently, the auditorium.

Editor's Note: 13 April 2022 marked the first mission trip by PP members since the COVID-19 pandemic began. Sisters Grace Mariaraja and Terilee Harrison travelled to India to work with brother Joel Madiki at the Gollaprolu Church of Christ. We praise God for the success of their trip and for returning them safely to us. This is their story.

Wednesday, 13 April

Grace Mariaraja and I (Terilee) flew out of Changi Airport late in the evening and arrived in Visakhapatnam well after midnight Singapore time. We were picked up at the airport by Jani Madiki, Joel's younger brother working in Visak. As we stood in the carpark loading up our luggage into the car, we thought, "It's so good to be home." It really felt like home away from home. We spent that first night at a local hotel close to the airport.

Thursday, 14 April

Jani picked us up at noon and a 3-hour drive became a 5.5 hour journey through heavy traffic to Pithapuram, the Madikis' home. What a delight it was to reunite with this (our) family for the first time in 27 months. When we left Pithapuram in January 2020, we had no clue that Covid would keep us apart for so long. We arrived at 7pm (IST) and exchanged teary hugs.



We made another 30-minute journey to Sudha Madiki's home to meet the extended family and have dinner. To honour our arrival, Joel's other brother Paul and his family also joined us for what felt like a long-awaited reunion. Needless to say, there was another round of teary hugs. We reviewed our schedule of events for the next few days and spent time going over our lessons with our translators (Sudha and Ruth Madiki) to prepare for the sharing on Friday and Saturday.



Friday, 15 April, 2022.

The church ladies meet every Good Friday for a Women's Retreat from 11 am to 3 pm. Traditionally, they collectively fast until after the retreat is over. Some of them don't even drink water! It was such a joy to be reunited with the ladies of the congregation and a delight to see the children.

When we arrived at the church, the ladies' vibrant singing greeted us and we felt a sense of belonging and excitement. There were almost 100 people packed into the tiny building. We recognised many of their happy faces and greeted them with 2 palms together (traditional Indian greeting). What joy to be (re)united with the ladies of the congregation and what a delight to see the children. It is amazing to see and be in the presence of these devout ladies and children – they sit on the hard floor or benches for hours in sweltering heat, mesmerized by God's word. It made us wonder why we rarely feel this way. There is so much to learn from these people who have so little and yet so much!

The theme of the retreat was "Cross Bearers." There were 3 lessons taught: Understanding the Cross (Terilee), Bearing the Cross (Ruth Madiki), and Enduring the Cross (Sudha Turugopu). The finale lesson would be shared at worship by Joel entitled "Celebrating the Cross."



After the Retreat, it was catch up time and we had to pry ourselves away to go home and prepare for the evening session. By then, our SIBI graduate Kiran Babu and his wife Sowjanya had arrived by train to the Madiki's home. There was not enough time in this trip to visit Kiran and Sowjanya and the Reddy Palem Church of Christ in their village in Guntur. Therefore, we were blessed they were sponsored by PPCOC to visit us at the Madiki's for the weekend. It was a blessing to encourage them and get to know Sowjanya and the work Kiran was doing at Guntur.

Soon, it was time for the 10th Annual Women's Meeting of the Gollaprolu Church of Christ. The theme was "Look to Jesus." There were 2 lessons in the first evening: "Look to Jesus in Sinking/Struggling Times" (Grace) and "Look to Jesus in Times of Grief" (Terilee). The turn out was as good as pre-Covid times with over 200 ladies showing up. There were a number of men, as well as youths who helped out.

After the meeting, we spent time greeting them, acceding to numerous "selfie madam" requests (they love taking photos with us), serving them food and fellowshipping with the ladies. We reached home close to midnight and hit the bed feeling tired physically but nourished spiritually.

Saturday, 16 April, 2022.

We met with some of the DMM (Disciple Maker Movement) Women's Ministry leaders in the Madiki's home. This was the same group of women that we had met with and taught in 2018. We were delighted to meet them again after 4 years.

Initially, Joel had told us that it was just a catch-up session but we were actually "requested" to present a lesson each. Terilee, being ever so resourceful, quickly put together a lesson outline (on the life of Moses), and we had an uplifting session with the women leaders.

It is my experience that when I (Grace) share without preparation, God fills all my lack and the sharing turned out to be way better than what I could imagine. We sang hymns in English and they sang for us in Telugu and God was glorified.

We enjoyed a lunch with the women leaders and we felt that we somehow played a small part in empowering the ladies to live purposefully and step forward as they pursue God and minister in their own localities.



We got ready for the second evening of the Women's Meeting. There were 2 lessons shared: Look to Jesus When Others are Struggling and Need Help (Grace) and Look to Jesus for the Reward (Sudha).

Again, the meeting was packed with over 200 ladies and some men. It was round 2 of greetings, "selfie madam", serving food and fellowshipping with them. In the lessons shared, we were purposeful in learning from hindsight what Covid taught us and how Jesus brought us through the difficult times.

Grace and I wish to acknowledge and thank our translators: Ruth Madiki, Sheela Madiki, and Sudha Turagopu for their relentless dedication to working alongside us.

Sunday, 17 April

We were blessed to worship with the congregation at Gollaprolu COC on Sunday morning. The hall was super packed and we had to tip toe to our seats in front as the wooden benches, the aisles and the floor were full of members. Joel preached and concluded the Cross series. After the services, the ladies honored us as their guests, and they also had a cake cut to celebrate the marriage of Kiran and Sowjanya.

As it was our return home day, we could not stay long but we were reminded that the kids were waiting for us in their bible classes. We loved greeting them one last time before we left. It was heart wrenching to leave not knowing for sure when we will return.



After church, we had a final thank-you and goodbye lunch with the entire Madiki family before heading to the airport. We discussed how we could move forward, including getting together online and leverage technology several times a year to reach a wider group of women across India and beyond. We are prayerfully going to meet and discuss this further.

Things That Touched Our Hearts

(1) The ladies of the church practise and perform songs as a choir lifting their voices to the Lord. When they sing, they wear matching pink sarees. During the evening meeting, some children from the congregation (the daughters of the choir members) approached Joel, to his surprise, and asked if they could sing as well.



They had been noticing their mothers' music ministry and wanted to participate. They came to the meeting and sang beautifully, and all were wearing white and black to match. They did this all on their own accord with no mentoring or help. What a blessing to see and hear God's hand in their lives!

(2) Several times throughout the weekend, there were opportunities for the ladies to give their testimonies. It was refreshing to see that the ladies were neither self-conscious nor afraid to come forward to take the mic and share, usually with tears flowing freely. Though we could not understand most of what they said, we could feel their pain and their faith in God. It was so encouraging to see their boldness for the Lord and they inspired us.

(3) We learned some ladies had to go overseas to work, leaving their children behind, because the men of the house were given to alcohol. O how heartbreaking!

(4) We love listening to the ladies pray! The prayers are fast and furious and full of feelings (FFFF). We cannot understand them at all, but their prayers bring us to tears—how they cry out to the Lord and how passionately they pray from the heart. We will do well to emulate.

(5) At the Sunday service, We noticed an egg and plastic bottle of milk on the altar at worship and asked Joel what that was. He said it was an offering. They often receive such offerings — it is all some of their members have to give. This really touched our hearts and reminded us of the widow's 2 mites.

Grace and I sincerely thank PPCOC for this opportunity and privilege to minister in India and to be one of the first mission teams to travel post-COVID.

Joel Madiki and the church at Gollaprolu wish to thank PPCOC for our partnership and support in ministry all these years. We pray for the opportunity to continue serving together for many years to come.
