Spiritual Leaders

"Character is not limited to having wisdom to comment on the behaviour of others. Intellectually knowing how to act, think and feel consistently with Bible principles may be a far cry from actually living in harmony with those principles. A person with true character doesn't just verbally tell other people what to do, but lives as an example worthy of following." - Frank Damazio

Many assume that great leaders must be gifted with talents, charisma, and other competencies. But is that really so? Consider the following passages:

"But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at his physical stature, because I have refused him. For the LORD does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart." (1 Samuel 16:7)

Every way of a man is right in his own eyes, but the LORD weighs the hearts. (Proverbs 21:2)

The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked; who can know it? I, the LORD, search the heart, I test the mind, even to give every man according to his ways, according to the fruit of his doings. (Jeremiah 17:9-10)

1. The heart is the most important aspect of a leader.

"For whatever is in your heart determines what you say. A good person produces good words from a good heart, and an evil person produces evil words from an evil heart. And I tell you this, that you must give an account on judgment day of every idle word you speak. The words you say now reflect your fate then; either you will be justified by them or you will be condemned. (Mt. 12:33-37). NLT.

2. The leader's heart has a big impact on the leader's fruit.

According to the biblical worldview, the heart has many functions, including thought (Matt 9:4; Mark 2:8), remembrance, reflection and meditation (Psalm 77:5-6; Luke 2:19). It is the generator of our physical, intellectual and emotional lives. Every aspect of our life is affected by our heart. (Proverbs 4:23). The heart is where you make choices motivated by your desires. David "had it in his heart to build a temple for God."1 Kings 8:17

3. Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it springs the issues of life.

Which brings us all the way back to the Shema. Every day, God's people were called to devote to God their body and mind, feelings and desires, futures and failures. This is what it means to love the Lord your God with all your heart. It affects everything we do.

Spiritual Biblical leaders:

- a. Submit to the laws of God with their hearts.
- b. Are humble before God and the people they serve.
- c. Do not use their positions for self-gratification.

God's family needs godly, spiritual leaders with a heart for God to:

- a. Provide the flock with spiritual sustenance.
- b. Keep them accountable.
- c. Guide them in their decision-making.
- d. Correct or discipline them when needed.
- e. Equip them for ministry.
- f. Keep them from going astray.

Conclusion: The greatest commandment according to Jesus is to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart" (Matt 22:37). Love here is more than emotion; it is a conscious commitment to the Lord. We need leaders whose hearts are aligned to God. Leaders are:

1. Teachers of God's disciples, helping them build a biblical foundation and preparing them for their spiritual calling and service.

2. Guides to spiritual sojourners, leading them to reach their eternal destination.

3. Sherpas to spiritual mountain climbers, helping them draw nearer to God.

4. Master-craftsmen to spiritual apprentices, helping them learn and gain competencies for their spiritual character building.

Reflection, Prayer, and Meditation

1. God looks at us on the inside, not just on the outside.

"And you shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart" Mark 12:30. What are the essential characteristics of godly, spiritual leaders?

2."Keep your heart with all vigilance, for from it flows the springs of life. Put away from you crooked speech, and put devious talk far from you. Let your eyes look directly forward, and your gaze be straight before you. Ponder the path of your feet; then all your ways will be sure" Proverbs 4:23-26. As we face the challenges in our personal character development in each stage of life, what solutions can we identify from God's Word of Life to overcome them?

3. "Let us come forward to the Holy of Holies with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water" Hebrews 10:22.

Review our "heart" in our personal character development and reflect on our actions needed to grow as a spiritual leader of God.

Grant us strength, Lord, to grow and become the godly spiritual example in our home and family, church and our community in accordance to Your Holy Spirit inspired Word.
