
Nominations for Elders, Deacons & Board



Our leadership renewal process begins today! Do pick up a nomination form after worship today.


Our six-week sermon series in June-July has been preparing us for this season. It is a time to discern and identify the men in our congregation who are full of the Spirit and willing to serve the church.


One trait that we will remember Barnabas for is his heart of service. Ever one with a heart for those in need, Barnabas would often extend himself to assist those who approached him.

True Repentance Overcomes Sin

Sin attempts to overthrow our Lord God from His place of supremacy. It seeks to rid Him from our bodies, which are the temple of God. Put another way, the greatest sufferer for any sin committed is us! And then there is our Saviour, Jesus Christ, who died for us!

Sin invites us to blaspheme the name of the God. "As it is written: 'God's name is blasphemed among the Gentiles because of you." (Romans 2:24)

Sin persecutes the Lord Jesus. "As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?' 'Who are you, Lord?' Saul asked. 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting,' he replied." (Acts 9:3-5)

Sin resists the Holy Spirit. "You stiff-necked people, with uncircumcised hearts and ears! You are just like your fathers: You always resist the Holy Spirit! Was there ever a prophet your fathers did not persecute? They even killed those who predicted the coming of the Righteous One. And now you have betrayed and murdered him." (Acts 7:51-52)

Sin grieves the Holy Spirit. "And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption." (Ephesians 4:30)

Sin crucifies the Lord Jesus. "It is impossible for those who have once been enlightened, who have tasted the heavenly gift, who have shared in the Holy Spirit, who have tasted the goodness of the word of God and the powers of the coming age, if they fall away, to be brought back to repentance, because to their loss they are crucifying the Son of God all over again and subjecting Him to public disgrace." (Hebrews 6:4-6)

Sin puts out the Spirit's fire. "Do not put out the Spirit's fire." (1 Thessalonians 5:19)

How shall we repent of sin? As David prayed, 'Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me.' (Psalm 139:23)

- 1. As God brings our sins to mind, write them down. Make a list of your sins.
- 2. Then, ask 'Is there anything else? 'As He shows us more sins, write down every sin He shows us.
- 3. Don't be in a hurry and don't make excuses. Make our list as complete as possible.
- 4. Next, confess and ask God for forgiveness. Pray carefully through the complete list, confessing them one at a time. In 1 John 1:9, God assures us that: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."
- 5. Renounce sin by the Name of Jesus Christ, the Name above all names, using the full power of the Holy Spirit available to us!

 NOTE: When we come into agreement with God about our sin, He restores us. We are forgiven and cleansed by the blood of Jesus

Prayer:

Father, we desire to have a strong and binding relationship with You. Open our eyes so they can see the glory of Jesus. Open our hearts so that they can hear your voice. Break the yoke of sins in our lives, so we may be willing to repent. May your Holy Spirit and Word convict our hearts unto repentance. Bring us out of darkness! Save our souls so that You may be glorified in Your Light! Bless us with the joy of salvation in Christ. In His Name, we pray. Amen.
