INDIA MISSION PARTNERSHIP

God wants all whom HE has saved to serve HIM in whatever situations HE puts them.

What I've learned in the 2010 to 2019 India Mission partnership with Bro. Joel Madiki:

- 1. New and old believers should immediately begin bearing witness for Jesus Christ. I have learnt by doing, not just by acquiring head knowledge. Of course you need a certain amount of head knowledge before you speak out for the Lord. But there is no better way to learn than to get involved and get nailed!
- 2. New and old believers should take time to deepen their roots with the Lord. I am encouraged to deepen my knowledge of scripture by reading and studying it until I know it well.
- Servant-leaders should be prepared to face opposition and rejection from within the church and without. Often we are naive to think that since God loves us, He will protect us from all trials and hardship.
- 4. Mature Christians should be quick to come alongside younger Christians to encourage and accept their efforts in mission ministry (Galatians 1:18-19).
- 5. All servant-leaders should use times of peace to build up one another in the Lord and to continue reaching out with the Gospel of Christ. (Acts 9:19-31).



Take home:

I am reminded of the shortness of life, and so we make every opportunity count for eternity.

But when the pressure is off, the danger is that we will kick back and coast, rather than to be disciplined to seek the Lord.

Our goal in our relationships with one another as believers should be to build up one another in Christ (Romans 14:19).

We should use peaceful times to continue reaching out to the lost with the gospel. We should not get comfortable, and forget about the condition of souls without Christ.

"Someone has said that secret discipleship is a contradiction in terms. Either the secrecy kills the discipleship, or the discipleship kills the secrecy."

If our Lord Jesus came to seek and to save the lost (Luke 19:10), then we must commit ourselves to the same goal.

PROVINCIAL YOUTH CAMP - ARTHUR GTATARA (PNG)

Arthur Gtatara graduated from SIBI Singapore in 2016 and, after his graduation, continues to be active in Melanesian Bible College (MBC) and other ministries in Papua New Guinea (PNG). One of the many activities that he helped organised was the Provincial Youth Camp. Below is his report about the camp that was conducted this year.

Brief History: Morobe Province is one of the biggest provinces in Papua New Guinea. The province has ten districts and those districts have a good number of Church of Christ congregations. Jab Mesa and I, together with other brothers in Morobe, came up with a plan to have the provincial youth camp. The aim of this camp is to bring youth from all parts of Morobe together to know each other and hear God's word. The outcome of this idea was fruitful as many young people are now actively involved in leading and preaching in various congregations in Morobe.

Apart from the camp, we also visit each district every year to strengthen the church and the Christians. This year in April, we went to Tami and next year we will travel to Kabwum district.

The fourth Morobe Provincial Youth Camp was held at Tami Island. The guest speaker was Elmer Palacio from Babag Church of Christ, Cebu Philippines. Brother Elmer was the first Asian brother-in-Christ to speak at the camp. The message he shared at the camp was so powerful and moving that among the 350 participants, 15 souls responded and were added to the Lord's church.

Christians and youth from six districts of Morobe attended the camp. They travelled for five to six days to attend the camp. Fortunately, their journey to the camp venue and return back to their home village after camp went well, without danger or injuries.

At the camp, the youth enjoyed swimming at the sea and had fun games at the beach. We praised God Almighty and the people who supported us to host this camp successfully. God is praised!

The next Morobe Provincial Youth camp will be held in Asama, Waria Valley from 24-28 Dec 2020. Over 600 to 700 youth and Christians will be attending the camp and the guest speaker will come from Singapore. The preparation for the camp is underway at this moment as the Churches of Christ in Waria and I are doing fundraising.

So far, we have raised K2000 (approx. S\$815), by selling chicken and noodles. The total amount for the camp is K15000 (approx. S\$6,100). This money will go towards the buying of canvas and a small generator to light up the camp sites, store food, and so on. Please pray for us as we gather those these things for the camp. God is faithful!
