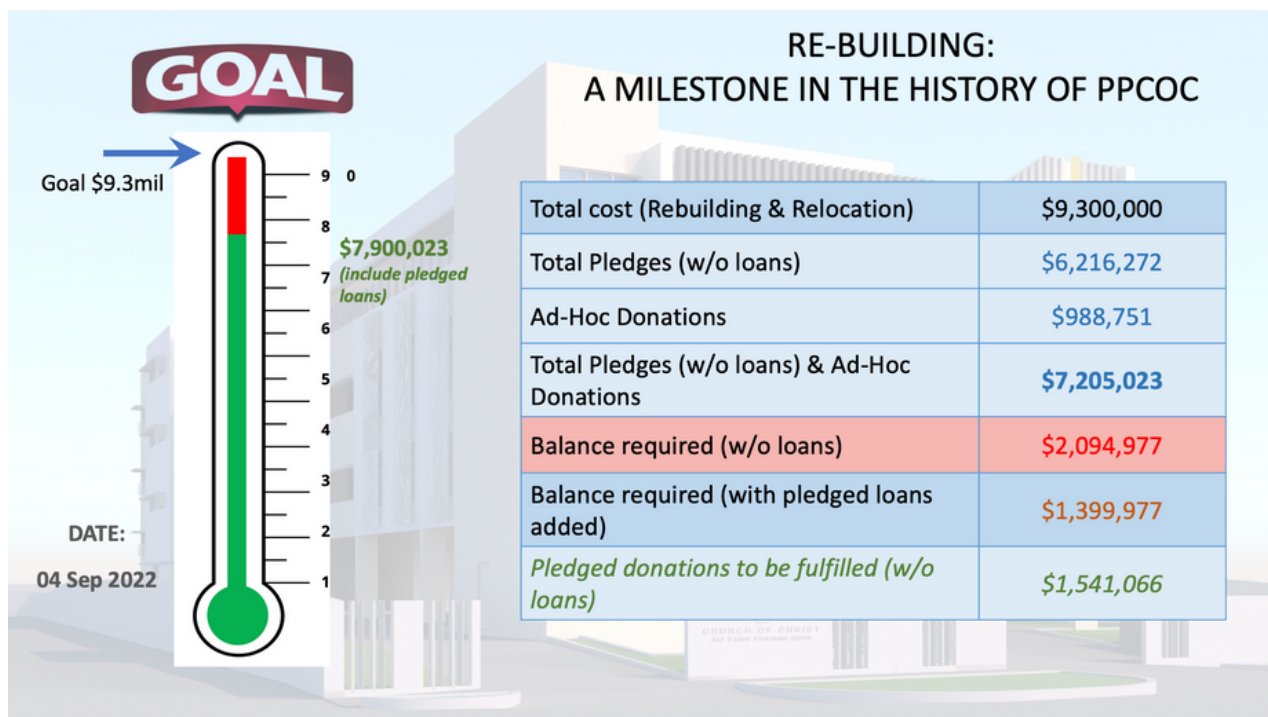

Rebuilding Update

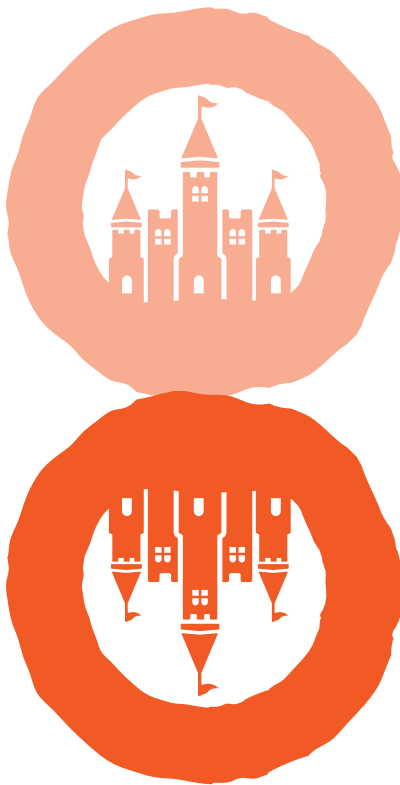

Upside Down

“These men who have turned the world upside down have come here also ... saying that there is another king, Jesus.” Acts 17:6-7 (ESV)

Jesus’ ministry turned the world upside down. His teaching attracted huge crowds. Disciples were following him. It was a successful ministry. Yet Jesus often went off to lonely places for solitude and prayer. In a world filled with frantic action, chaos, and busyness, Jesus demonstrated what life looked like in the upside-down Kingdom.

So, slow down. Be silent. Be alone. Pray. What would life look like, if our decisions were born out of this kind of God-given peace, rather than the chaos of this world? Our lives would be flipped upside-down too.

The worldly kingdom tells us time is money. But in the upside-down kingdom God tells us that time is life, that is, eternal life! God’s people are filled by a remarkable reversal of values. The things that the world prize dearly are not the drivers or motivation for God’s people.

For kingdom folks, time is life! In God’s upside-down kingdom, we treasure the future and the eternal more than the temporary things of the present. We are not controlled or conditioned by power, success, comfort, or recognition.

Be alert to how the world’s values can take control of how we live and behave! We have to be constantly mindful of how the values of this world can lure and ruin our relationship with our King. As Christians living in the upside-down kingdom, we are freed from these worldly lures of life.

We must place our priority with the King and let Him reorder our lives. This protects us from the lures of the world. These lures don’t drive or control us anymore. We can choose to take them or leave them. That is the mark of someone who lives in the upside-down kingdom!

Lesson #1 —The Spiritual Kingdom is ruled by the Spirit of God

Jesus contrasted the outward hypocritical manifestations of religious rituals with the inner change in life that yields spiritual fruit. The kingdom of God is present today as God's Spirit rules in the lives of believers.

Lesson #2 — Social realities point us to mundane concerns

Our social realities comprise houses, friends, salary, status, recreation, and our need for love, creativity, and happy relationships. Although the spiritual is not totally independent of the social reality, the two realities belong to separate worlds. This split between spiritual and social leads to a filtered understanding of the Scripture. It tempts us to turn Jesus' message into merely a motivational speech which dilutes the truth of the atoning death of Jesus. We also overlook the point that Jesus modelled for us a new way of living.

Lesson #3 — Spiritual realities can be clearly seen in the life of Christ

God entered into the social and economic structures of human affairs. Jesus came in human flesh to reveal to us the very nature and spiritual realm of God. The Incarnation of Christ made the spiritual realm real in the upside-down spiritual kingdom on earth. Words and deeds blended into a single reality in Emmanuel (God with us). God spoke to us not through 'languages' but through a Son—living as one of us (Heb. 1:2).

Questions:

1. "Am I living a life in which I'm controlled by what the world says, or am I living a life like Christ?"
2. What does the kingdom of God look like to you? Will God be comfortable in 'your' kingdom?
3. We are to seek ye first the Kingdom of God? How would you go about living this out?

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, may the world see us and catch a glimpse of the glorious spiritual blessings that flow down to us like a funnel from above. Help us make the same choice that the apostles did, such that they were even willing to give their earthly life in exchange for eternal life. Lord, as we walk in the Spirit, grant us the spiritual strength and will to live our lives for Your glory. In Christ's name, we pray. Amen.
