Keeping an Eternal Perspective in a Temporal World

"Set your mind on things above, not on earthly things." (Colossians 3:2)

In Matthew 6:19-20 Jesus said, "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal."

So, what is temporal in this life?

According to the American Dictionary of the English Language, "temporal" derives from the Latin "temporalis", which comes from the root "tempus" meaning "time". It pertains to this life, this world or the body only. Temporal affairs are opposed to the spiritual. It is measured and limited by time, or by this life or this state of things; having limited existence; opposed to eternal.

Sometimes we forget that when we get caught up in daily routines, irksome pains, and chasing after our life goals. Yes, our earthly struggles and pains are real, but even an entire lifetime of physical pain or loss is temporal. We often lose our spiritual focus even when eternity is all that matters!

Life is about fulfilling God's purpose for us. We must focus, therefore, on His eternal perspective. James 4:14 says the human life is "a vapour: it appears for a while and then vanishes." Life isn't about accumulating the temporal - money, power, or fame.

Realise that suffering on earth is momentary

2 Cor 4:17 tells us that our afflictions here on earth are "light and momentary" and are "achieving for us an eternal glory" that will far outweigh anything else. In other words, the things we experience here on earth are shaping us and preparing us for eternal life.

We need not be fearful of the temporal afflictions of life

People fear many things, especially death. But 1 John 4:18 tells us that there is no fear in love and that perfect love drives out fear. We have perfect love from our Saviour. On the cross, He demonstrated perfect love by defeating sin, suffering, and death (1 Cor. 15:55-58). Jesus has made available to us eternal life. This means we no longer have to be fearful of anything, not even death. God wants us to embrace and embody the love he has extended to us.

It is all about our personal choice!

Jesus lived his life with an eternal perspective. His obedience would result in his exaltation and the salvation of many. The obedience of Christ bought our eternal salvation. It all comes down to whether we want to live life to fulfil the demands of the temporal world or the eternal world.

Although we live on earth, God created us for eternity. As Ecclesiastes 3:11 says, "[God] has also put eternity in their hearts." We may live in time, but eternity must be the backdrop of our life.

We should live in thankful obedience to Christ, with grateful hearts overflowing with love for God. Remember, though heaven and earth pass away, God's truth will never disappear (Matt. 24:35). It is vital to learn to live life in preparation for the eternal. This eternal perspective affects our priorities and actions.

Reflection:

Spend some time pondering about eternity.
In what ways can you reflect on God's eternal truths today?
What will it be like to see Jesus face to face, to be completely free of sin, and to be fully restored? How will it change how you think and act?
How does that future hope help you live in obedience today?

Prayer:

Loving Lord and Heavenly Father, thank You for the opportunity to spend time in Your Word and prepare my heart for this devotion. You hold the world and the future in Your hands. Everything we see today is set in motion by You. Help me to see things with an eternal perspective and discard the temporary wants and replace them with actions that pertain to Your Kingdom. Give me insight and understanding as I read and reflect on Your Word, and may I mature in the faith, as well as grow in grace and a deeper knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. All these we ask in Jesus' name. Amen.
