What's the hardest part of being a Christian?

We don't enjoy being disciplined. We have embraced individualism more than we are willing to admit. Selfgratification overrules the spirit of considering others and their needs. We tend to seek our immediate longings and desires.

"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others." (Phil 2:3-4)

But the child in us will argue that the world we live in applauds the 'winners' with rewards and remunerations for being champions in all areas of life's endeavours.

The reason we don't like to be disciplined is that it involves shortterm pain. We're inclined to protect our feelings from being hurt. "For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it." (Hebrews 12:11)

Those who have been trained by it will yield the fruit of righteousness. From this perspective, even the most painful discipline is actually an expression of love. Christian discipline always seeks a child's best interest.

Like God, a mature parent accepts a child's rebellion and says, "That's okay, you don't need to love me right now. You'll understand it in years to come." It hurts temporarily, but to compromise a child's welfare will hurt a lot worse later, or even result in a lifetime of pain and regrets.

All athletes understand the need to discipline and train themselves if they desire to be winners. They need to obey the training rules and submit to the plans of their coaches and trainers. But the results are worth it!

When we teach our children godly submission, we are teaching them to do the right thing for the right reason and get them to move to obey in love and trust. Discipline primarily starts externally at first, but eventually, it should be internalised and integrated into their character and self-discipline.

As parents, we need to model for our children what we desire in them by our personal godliness and submission to God. How we speak and act towards others will greatly influence who our children become.

Reflection:

- 1.What do we need in every relationship so the Spirit of God can bear fruits of love, patience, gentleness and kindness in our relationships as we practise spiritual discipline?
- 2.If you are the one receiving discipline, how do you want the discipline to be meted out?
- 3.List the lessons from God's Word shared in the devotional and put them into practice.

Pray for God's guidance and strength as you resolve to put into practice God's Word of Life and Light.

Prayer:

Gracious God, please help me develop control over the words I speak, so they are gracious and appropriate and fit the occasion. May my words be filled with Your graciousness and hope even when I am being disciplined. Help me not to blurt out words that might hurt or offend others but may my words be filled with Your wisdom and love. Develop a godly filter over my mouth and help me discipline myself to praise You and encourage others. In Christ's name I pray. Amen.
