

Celebrate!God's Covenant Gift

What is a covenant? A covenant is a binding legal agreement. When two people sign a covenant, it binds them legally to carry out the provisions of the covenant.

When God made a covenant promise with old and childless Abram and Sarai (later Abraham and Sarah), He promised them that they would have countless descendants and that He would give them the land of Canaan.

That meant a lot to them. In the ancient world, a woman's value was traditionally defined by her ability to provide heirs. A man's worth was counted in descendants and land. Family legacy was passed on through a firstborn son. God was making a covenant that He would restore their honour and value.

It seemed impossible to Sarah, but Abraham believed. God took him outside and said, "Look up at the sky and count the stars—if indeed you can count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your offspring be." Abram believed the Lord, and he credited it to him as righteousness (Genesis 15:5-6).

In Paul's writing, he corrected the idea that only Jews are eligible for God's covenant.

"Understand, then, that those who have faith are children of Abraham. Scripture foresaw that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, and announced the gospel in advance to Abraham: "All nations will be blessed through you." So those who rely on faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith (Gal 3:7-9).

God's new covenant never divides who is "in" and who is "out". It is a better covenant and a better promise (Heb 8:6). The New Covenant a gift from God, founded on His purposes and sustained by His grace.

At baptism, we make the covenant to serve the Lord and keep his commandments. Each first day of the week, when we partake of the Lord's Supper, we renew that covenant with God and accept the covenant of the priesthood as God's Holy Temple. This new and everlasting covenant of the gospel allows us to qualify for marriage as Christ's bride, the church of CHRIST.

We, the bride of Christ, have an eternal bond with the bridegroom, who sits on the throne of God. Therefore, Christ dwells in us by His Spirit (Gal 2:20).

Reflective Thoughts:

In the time of Christ, being born Jew came with a lot of benefits. In our day, we might ask these questions:

- · What benefit is it to be baptized and to have a covenant with God?
- · What benefit is it to be a kid raised in a Christian home?
- · List the benefits of being a part of the covenant of God's community.

Prayer:

Gracious God, because we are Your children, please send forth the Holy Spirit into our hearts. Open our eyes to see that the Holy Spirit in us is the very same Spirit that dwells in God's Son. For through the Holy Spirit, the living Christ lives in us. In Christ's name I pray. Amen.
