India Mission Trip

Reflections by Grace Mariaraja

When God calls, there is no running away - unless I want to live inside a belly or something equally gross.

In February 2023, I was in Guntur on a mission trip. It was a last-minute decision to accompany John and Wendy, who were first timers to India. However, touched by the love and eager-hearted brethren there, I progressed to exploring the idea of buying a little vacant house opposite Reddy Palem COC. When the team asked about my job in Singapore, I jokingly declared that I was just a part-time lawyer and a full-time missionary. Little did I know that I would be held to my words.

Right after the Guntur trip, Brother Joel Madiki requested a PP team to speak at their Annual Women's Meet over the Good Friday weekend. I replied "unlikely" (which meant "no") because of work plus other commitments in April. However, he persisted and so, I turned over the decision to God and PP Board for approval. Meanwhile, while I couldn't recruit local sisters (mostly due to the short notice), I had the wild idea of recruiting my white Indian sister and 4-time mission buddy, Terilee. Though half a world away, she agreed! Unfortunately, we had to shelve the plan due to budget constraints. A bummer? Nope, it was just God's humour in action.

About two weeks later, out of the blue, Elder Peter asked me to provide the trip dates and a budget. On 11 March 2023, a go-ahead was given by the Board. In just two weeks, our plans were finalised, flight tickets were booked, visas were obtained and I even got a new passport. Terilee flew out of Houston on 31 March to reach Singapore on 2 April and we left for India on 5 April 2023. We aptly named the trip "Mission made possible".

We were truly delighted to meet our family in Gollaprolu again! The folks as usual drenched us with love and warmth. The hospitality and generosity of the Madiki family remain unparalleled.

The 7 days (5-11 April) were physically tiring but spiritually uplifting. We taught the ladies and children from Friday through Sunday and each time, God's presence was felt in our midst.

I have hundreds of photos of my Indian sisters and brothers in my phone from our trips over the years. It meant so much to Grace and I this trip when young people would show us pictures in their phone from years ago—implying our visits were meaningful to them.

We thank sisters Terilee and Grace M for sharing heart-touching messages with the ladies in Gollaprolu COC and Yerravaram COC. The DMM group of ladies was encouraged by their personal sharing. The presence and love of these sisters who brought blessings and greetings from PP refreshed all of us. We eagerly look forward to what God has in store for us. With every mission trip, new avenues and areas to serve open up. Lord willing, we want to continue conducting VBS locally and in other COCs and look into programs for the youth, Young Adults and Spiritual Leadership training in Gollaprolu and other areas of Andhra Pradesh. Lord willing, we are praying and looking forward to our first Medical Mission.

We seek God's blessings upon our partnership with PP to help us take these programs forward. We thank the Elders, members and Indian Mission interest group for your commitment and support. May we continue to bring God's love to all around us. God Bless!
